### ENTER VS ENTER



#### **Enter vs Enter**

The "Enter" key on your keyboard can be used to activate any button with a shadow behind it. For example the "OK" button or the shadowed button in a Yes/No box. Another use of your "Enter" key is to move the cursor to the next line when entering text in a multi-line text field (as you would in word processing).

The thing is though, there are two enter keys on a computer keyboard! If you try to use the Enter key that is beside the number pad, you will get different results.

The Enter key beside the number pad will activate any button with a shadow behind it just as above. The difference is if you are in a multi-line text field, this enter button will not advance you to the next line – it will activate the button.
